Lambda Chapter was recently awarded host city honors at the 73rd ADG National Convention held recently in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

Lambda Chapter President and National Vice President of Internal Affairs, Daniel Rocha said, "Lambda Chapter is honored to be hosting the 2006 national convention in Los Angeles. We look forward to showcasing both Los Angeles and LMU to our brothers from around the country."
